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Homelessness in Olmsted County - Background

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Overview of efforts 2018-Present

2018

- Cold Weather Shelter only
- People started staying in the Skyways

2019

- City response to skyways
- City/County supported a seasonal shelter

2020

- Housing Stability Team
- Covid Response System Established





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Overview of efforts 2018-Present

2021

- County/City supporting a year-round shelter
- Housing Outreach Center opened (ECHO Center)

2022

- Street Medicine launched
- Shelter Workgroup
- Social workers in schools





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Current Situation

- The Rochester Community Warming Center is at/over capacity
- 1,002 people were experienced homelessness during 2022
- 31% increase in students experiencing homelessness
- 15-20 evictions per week (approximately 2-3 month delay)
- Emergency Assistance exhausted until July 1, 2023
- Excess demand for family shelter
