Talofa/Greetings Madame Chair and Committee Members,

My name is Susuga Leiataua Dr. Robert Jon Peterson. I am a small business owner and education leader and advocate here in Minnesota. I am writing to lend my full support for HF 2537.

As an educator of 25 years, I know how important it is for students of all backgrounds to be provided with multiple opportunities to learn, grow, and achieve. The Minnesota Post Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) program is a primary example of how good policy can become even better policy through the concerted advocacy efforts advanced by young people, and people of all ages, in partnership with progressive and equity-centered legislative authorship. The provisions in HF 2537 strengthen the PSEO program in ways that will benefit students of all backgrounds and particularly People of Color and Indigenous students (POCI).

For example, requiring secondary and postsecondary institutions who enroll pupils in PSEO by contract agreements to annually report to the Commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Education (MDE):

- PSEO enrolled pupils participation rates,
- the number of pupils enrolled, and
- the number of courses taken for postsecondary credit

represents a research-based approach to gathering more data on students' engagement levels in PSEO that will help to inform future decision-making about how to advance and improve the program in Minnesota for current and future generations of college-going students.

Additionally, proposed language in HF 2537 centered on ensuring PSEO enrolled students' access to scholarships, participation in leadership roles and/or national organizations at their respective high schools creates increased opportunities for greater equity to be attained by students who participate in PSEO. PSEO enrolled students deserve the same access to opportunities experienced by their non-PSEO enrolled peers and this proposal represents a big step in the direction of greater equity for each student.

Lastly, by providing greater accountability for the alignment of weighted grading policies, applicable to both PSEO and concurrent enrollment credits earned via coursework, HF 2537 proposes -and rightly so- to make more equitable the academic experiences of

students who engage in PSEO in terms of how their GPA's are calculated in comparison to their peers who enroll concurrently.

Overall, I fully support Rep. Hassan's bill, HF 2537, and am strongly encouraging the Committee to vote yes for its inclusion in the omnibus education bill.

Dear Senate and House Education Policy Committees,

People for PSEO, whose statewide membership consists of 643 students, parents, and supporters of the PSEO program, and the undersigned write to express our strong support of proposed revisions to the Post-Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) statute found in HF 2537 and SF 2359.

Since the 2014-15 school year, over 100,000 MN high school students have saved time and money on college through the PSEO program. However, significant barriers exist that prevent the PSEO program from being an even better opportunity for accelerated personal growth. We call on the Minnesota Legislature to continue our state's national leadership in providing excellent dual credit opportunities for our students by committing further resources towards the expansion and improvement of PSEO. The proposed revisions found in HF 2537/SF 2359 satisfy this call to action by expanding PSEO opportunities for rural students, low-income students, and students who have been historically excluded from accessing higher education.
