Bill Description

This bill establishes an Illicit Drug Use Task Force, which reviews data and reports related to illicit drug use and produces recommendations based on relevant data.

The bill includes a blank general fund appropriation to DPS for fiscal years 2025 and 2026. There is not an appropriation included in the bill for MDH.

Technical Comment

The bill does not include an appropriation for MDH nor does it include a provision of an inter-agency agreement between MDH and DPS.

Assumptions

The Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) is required under this bill to provide public data and summary data, as defined in Minnesota Statutes, section 13.02, subdivision 19, to the task force related to illicit drug use. The task force expires upon submission of its final report, which is due February 15, 2026, or, upon adjournment of the Minnesota Legislature, whichever is later. Based on our experiences with providing data for similar taskforces, this work will require MDH to dedicate 0.50 FTE staff in fiscal year 2025 and fiscal year 2026 to evaluate data sources related to illicit drug use, analyze data and report findings on illicit drug use in Minnesota, support the task force in interpreting findings, and conduct literature review to provide background knowledge for the task force members. Illicit drugs refer to a broad list of drugs, each with unique chemical composition and health effects, requiring MDH to access, analyze, and interpret data from multiple new data sources.

Bill Description

The bill establishes the Task Force on Holistic and Effective Responses to Illicit Drug Use. The appointments are to be made by August 31, 2024 with the first meeting to be held by September 30, 2024. Members are to serve without compensation. The initial report is due February 15, 2025 and the final report is due February 15, 2026.

The Department of Health, Department of Human Services, Department of Public Safety, Department of Corrections, Minnesota Sentencing Guidelines Commission (MSGC), county attorneys, and local public health agencies would be required to provide data to the task force.

Assumptions

The bill states that the task force or researchers at Rise Research shall receive public data and summary data as needed from executive agencies including the Department of Human Services. To meet this obligation, the Department would hire a contractor to provide data as needed to the task force.

The contract would begin in FY 2025 when the task force starts meeting and will be available through FY 2026.

The Department assumes that the contract will cost \$200 per hour for 375 hours in FY 2025 and 500 hours in FY 2026 totaling \$75,000 in FY 2025 and \$100,000 in FY 2026. The Department assumes collecting FFP at 32% for the cost of the contract.

Bill Description

In 2023, the legislature passed a grant for a report on illicit drug use in Minnesota. This bill establishes a task force to review the report and provide recommendations to implement and fund policies to address the use of illicit drugs.

Task Force on Holistic and Effective Responses to Illicit Drug Use.

Subd. 1. Establishment. Establishes a task force to review the reports on approaches to address illicit drug use prepared pursuant to the grant passed in the 2023 session and to develop recommendations based on that report.

Subd. 2. Membership. Identifies the membership of the Task Force on Holistic and Effective Responses to Illicit Drug Use. Requires appointment by August 31, 2024, and establishes that members serve without compensation.

Subd. 3. Duties. Establishes the duties of the task force, including reviewing relevant data, gathering public input, and making recommendations that include a specific implementation plan and timeline.

Subd. 4. Officers; meetings. Directs the director of the Office of Addiction and Recovery to convene the first meeting of the task force by September 30, 2024. Establishes that meetings are subject to the open meeting requirements. Permits the task force to access public data and summary data and authorizes the task force to request assistance from other organizations.

Subd. 5. Staff; meeting space. Directs the Office of Addiction and Recovery to provide space and administrative support for the task force.

Subd. 6. Reports. Requires the task force to submit an initial report and a final report to the legislature with recommendations that include proposed legislation and implementation plans.

Subd. 7. Expiration. Provides that the task force expires on the later of submission of its final report or adjournment of the 94th Minnesota Legislature (expected to be in May 2026).

Assumptions

The fiscal note assumes the following:

July 1, 2024, start date and February 1, 2026, end date

- · Task force will meet 15 times
- · Estimates include cost of two subgroups meeting up to 15 times
- Contractor will be onboard in September
- The Governor's Advisory Council on Opioids, Substance Use, and Addiction will be engaged to fulfill the duties under Subd. 3 (a)(3).
- Rise Research will manage the solicitation of data under Subd. 4(d)
- Task force meetings will be virtual. If the task force holds any in-person meetings, they will be held at the Centennial building or hosted by another state agency.

Minnesota Management and Budget (MMB) will use existing staff to provide support and administration related to implementation of this bill.

MMB expects to hire a contractor to develop work plan, facilitate meetings, and complete report and recommendations.

Bill Description

The bill establishes a 14-member Task Force on Holistic and Effective Responses to Illicit Drug Use ("task force"). The task force is assigned duties to include reviewing a report on approaches to address illicit drug use in Minnesota, which report the 2023 legislature commissioned Rise Research LLC to complete by March 1, 2025, with an initial report due by February 15, 2024. The task force must also collect, review, and analyze other relevant information and data; gather and consider input and feedback from the public; and develop policy and funding recommendations with a timeline for implementation. Task force appointments must be complete by August 31, 2024, with the first meeting to be convened by September 30, 2024. The task force's initial and final reports are due February 15, 2025, and February 15, 2026, respectively.

The bill requires executive branch agencies and local law enforcement agencies including the Department of Health, Department of Human Services, Department of Public Safety, Department of Corrections, Minnesota Sentencing Guidelines Commission (MSGC), county attorneys, and local public health agencies to provide public data and summary data as defined in Minn. Stat. § 13.02, subd. 9, to the task force and to Rise Research.

Assumptions

MSGC does not retain nonpublic data as described in Minn. Stat. § 13.02, subd. 9. It is assumed that MSGC will comply with the data request and provide its public data to the task force and Rise Research. MSGC will do this using its existing staff resources. MSGC regularly provides its public data to requestors including other state agencies and private entities. In 2023, MSGC staff responded to over 500 data requests which totaled over 12,000 staff hours.

Records containing bulk data provided to MSGC by the Minnesota Judicial Branch (MJB) retains the same level of accessibility at MSGC as they had at the Judicial Branch under Minn. Stat. § 13.03, subd. 4(e). Minn. Rule of Public Access to Records of the Judicial Branch 8, subd. 3, limits the bulk distribution of court records. Unless the recipient executes an agreement with the State Court Administrator (Rule 8, subd. 3(b)) or the State Court Administrator otherwise provides permission (Rule 8, subd. 3(d))something MSGC is unable to do on the State Court Administrator's behalfelectronic bulk data must be released with a case number as the only identifier (Rule 8, subd. 3(c)). It is assumed that the task force and Rise Research will enter into such an agreement if MJB data are to be distributed through MSGC.
