1.6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 121A.035, is amended to read:
1.8	121A.035 CRISIS MANAGEMENT POLICY.
1.9	Subdivision 1. Model policy. The commissioner shall maintain and make available to
1.10	school boards and charter schools a model crisis management policy that includes, among
1.11	other items, cardiac emergency response plans, school lock-down and tornado drills,
1.12	consistent with subdivision 2, and school fire drills under section 299F.30.
1.13	Subd. 2. School district and charter school policy. A school board and a charter school
1.14	must adopt a crisis management policy to address potential violent crisis situations in the
1.15	district or charter school. The policy must be developed cooperatively with administrators,
1.16	teachers, employees, students, parents, community members, law enforcement agencies,
1.17	other emergency management officials, county attorney offices, social service agencies,
1.18	emergency medical responders, and any other appropriate individuals or organizations. The
1.19	policy must include at least five school lock-down drills, five school fire drills consistent
1.20	with section 299F.30, and one tornado drill, and one cardiac emergency response drill

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Private schools and educational institutions not subject to section 121A.035 must have at least five school lock-down drills, five school fire drills consistent with section 299F.30, and one tornado drill, and one cardiac emergency response drill consistent with section 121A.241.

Sec. 3. [121A.241] CARDIAC EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN.

- Subdivision 1. Cardiac emergency response plan. (a) For purposes of this section, a "cardiac emergency response plan" is a written document that establishes specific steps to reduce death from cardiac arrest. A cardiac emergency response plan must integrate evidence-based core elements, such as those recommended by the American Heart Association in accordance with a published, peer-reviewed journal article or similar document.
- (b) Beginning in the 2024-2025 school year, a school district or charter school must develop a cardiac emergency response plan that addresses the appropriate use of school personnel to respond to incidents involving an individual experiencing sudden cardiac arrest or a similar life-threatening emergency while on school grounds or at a school-sponsored activity or event. A principal or other person having administrative control over the school site must ensure that the plan is:
- (1) available to the school community on the school website and in paper form at various locations at the school site;
 - (2) distributed to all coaches and other athletic staff members at each school site, all persons responsible for executing the plan in the event of a cardiac emergency, all health care professionals that provide medical services during school-sponsored activities or events, and to other appropriate school staff, as determined by school administrators; and
 - (3) annually reviewed, rehearsed, and revised, as necessary.
