- On R7, Senate language, (UEH1826-1)
- Page 7, delete section 14 and insert:

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- "Sec. 14. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 3.979, subdivision 3, is amended to read:
 - Subd. 3. **Audit data.** (a) "Audit" as used in this subdivision means a financial audit, program evaluation, special review, or investigation, or assessment of an allegation or report submitted to the legislative auditor.
 - (b) Notwithstanding any other law, data relating to an audit are not public or with respect to data on individuals are confidential or protected nonpublic until the final report of the audit has been released by the legislative auditor or the audit is no longer being actively pursued. Upon release of a final audit report by the legislative auditor, data relating to an audit are public except data otherwise classified as not public.
 - (c) Unless the data are subject to a more restrictive classification by another law, upon the legislative auditor's decision to no longer actively pursue an audit without the release of a final audit report, data relating to an audit are private or nonpublic except for data (1) relating to the audit's existence, status, and disposition; and (2) that document the work of the legislative auditor. For any such audit, data identifying individuals or nongovernment entities are private or nonpublic.
 - (b) (d) Data related to an audit but not published in the audit report and that the legislative auditor reasonably believes will be used in litigation are not public and with respect to data on individuals are confidential or protected nonpublic until the litigation has been completed or is no longer being actively pursued.
 - (e) (e) Data that could reasonably be used to determine the identity of an individual or entity supplying data for an audit are private or nonpublic if the data supplied by the individual were needed for an audit and the individual would not have been provided the data to the legislative auditor without an assurance that the individual's identity of the individual or entity would remain private or nonpublic, or the legislative auditor reasonably believes that the subject data would not have been provided the data.
 - (d) (f) The definitions of terms provided in section 13.02 apply for purposes of this subdivision Data related to an audit that were obtained from a nongovernmental entity have the classification that the data would have if obtained from the government entity for which the data were created, collected, or maintained by the nongovernmental entity.
