The programs at SPARK evoke creativity and wonder. Play enhances brain structure and promotes executive function, which is the process of learning. Children need to develop various skill sets to optimize their development and manage stress. Research demonstrates that developmentally appropriate play with caregivers and peers is a singular opportunity to promote the social-emotional, cognitive, language, and self-regulation skills that build executive function and a pro-social brain. Furthermore, play supports forming safe, stable, and nurturing relationships with all caregivers that children need to thrive. Children that have the opportunity to experience SPARK, even once, are working on these critical skills vital to being a successful learner in early childhood and beyond.

Our community needs access to SPARK, and these bills seek to provide funding that builds upon successful initiatives funded with previous appropriations from the arts and cultural heritage fund. SPARK would be able to provide access and engagement for diverse audiences through museum programs and exhibits that promote arts, culture, and history.
