1.7 chapter, chapter 196, or chapter 198 if the veteran or former service member was determined
1.8 by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs to have forfeited the veteran's or service
1.9 member's entitlement to federal benefits according to United States Code, title 38, chapter
1.10 61.

1.13 The commissioner shall appoint an administrator for each of the veterans homes. The
1.14 administrators act as the administrative head for their respective veterans homes. The
1.15 administrators shall have a current Minnesota nursing home administrator's license and shall
1.16 serve in the unclassified service. The salaries of the administrators are not subject to section
1.17 43A.17, subdivision 1. ~~The administrators serve at the pleasure of the commissioner and~~
1.18 ~~report directly to the commissioner.~~

2.3 Sec. 23. **PLANNING NEW VETERANS CEMETERIES.**

2.4 (a) The commissioner of veterans affairs shall determine a suitable site and plan for
2.5 ~~three~~ four new state veterans cemeteries, one to be located in northeastern Minnesota, one
2.6 to be located in northwestern Minnesota, one to be located in southeastern Minnesota, and
2.7 one to be located in southwestern Minnesota. In determining the site for a cemetery, the
2.8 commissioner shall consider available public land options and shall seek proposals for
2.9 donated land from interested counties, local communities, civic organizations, veterans
2.10 service organizations, and individuals.

2.11 (b) For determining the veterans cemetery site in southeastern Minnesota, the
2.12 commissioner shall give priority consideration to land owned and proposed for donation
2.13 by the county of Fillmore.

2.14 (c) The commissioner's planning process for a state veterans cemetery must include, at
2.15 a minimum, the following actions:

2.16 (1) determining the need for the cemetery;

2.17 (2) investigating the availability of suitable land for the cemetery;

2.18 (3) assessment of impacts of the cemetery;

2.19 (4) encouragement of support from veteran service organizations and local governments;
2.20 and

2.21 (5) preparation and submission of a preapplication for a grant from the United States
2.22 Department of Veterans Affairs for commitment of funding for establishing the cemetery.

2.23 (d) By January 15, 2011, the commissioner shall report to the chair and ranking minority
2.24 member of the house of representatives and senate committees having responsibility for
2.25 veterans affairs with a report of the commissioner's progress in implementing this section.
