



- Montgomery





Early Care & Education Grant Awards:

- ✓ 6 subgrants totaling \$175,000 made through the DEED Childcare Economic Development grant for facility expansion to increase child care





Early Care & Education Grant Reporting Highlights

YWCA - Mankato

"We met our goal of providing our families with developmentally appropriate toys, bilingual books in their home language, safety supplies, and diapers."

Project Description

The New American Families program works to eliminate barriers using the parents as Teacher Curriculum. This evidence-based curriculum focuses on families with children who are prenatal to five years of age to promote parent-child interaction, child development, and family well-being in a home visiting model. Our culturally specific and multilingual team currently serves Latinx, Somali and some additional East African communities.









Business Supports

Overall support in FY23 resulted in:

- √ 610 new child care slots
- √ 470 existing child care slots supported with technical assistance
- √ 44 case engagements more focus on community efforts versus individual provider engagement

Growth & Retention of Child Care Highlights:

✓ Supported a team in the development stages of a new child care center focusing on family-oriented settings in the Byron area.



- ✓ Provided guidance and support to family care provider in Wells, who faced a personal tragedy and sought assistance in moving forward.
- ✓ Little Villagers & Little Rebels: These programs both endured staffing challenges to their businesses and our work helped them move beyond to new foundational plans for their business

Conscious Discipline: Provided a total of 54 modules of self-paced Conscious Discipline Courses from January 2023 through January 2024


