1.3 Page 64, delete section 48

1.4 Page 76, after line 26, insert:

1.5 "Sec. 63. DENTAL HOME DEMONSTRATION PROJECT.

1.6 (a) The Dental Services Advisory Committee, in collaboration with stakeholders, shall
1.7 design a dental home demonstration project and present recommendations by February 1,
1.8 2022, to the commissioner and to the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative
1.9 committees with jurisdiction over health finance and policy.

1.10 (b) The Dental Services Advisory Committee, at a minimum, shall engage with the
1.11 following stakeholders: the Minnesota Department of Health, the Minnesota Dental
1.12 Association, the Minnesota Dental Hygienists' Association, the University of Minnesota
1.13 School of Dentistry, dental programs operated by the Minnesota State Colleges and
1.14 Universities system, and representatives of each of the following dental provider types
1.15 serving medical assistance and MinnesotaCare enrollees:

1.16 (1) private practice dental clinics for which medical assistance and MinnesotaCare
1.17 enrollees comprise more than 25 percent of the clinic's patient load;

1.18 (2) private practice dental clinics for which medical assistance and MinnesotaCare
1.19 enrollees comprise 25 percent or less of the clinic's patient load;

1.20 (3) nonprofit dental clinics with a primary focus on serving indigenous communities
1.21 and other communities of color;

1.22 (4) nonprofit dental clinics with a primary focus on providing eldercare;

1.23 (5) nonprofit dental clinics with a primary focus on serving children;

2.1 (6) nonprofit dental clinics providing services within the seven-county metropolitan
2.2 area;

2.3 (7) nonprofit dental clinics providing services outside of the seven-county metropolitan
2.4 area; and

2.5 (8) multispecialty hospital-based dental clinics.

2.6 (c) The dental home demonstration projects shall provide incentives for the provision
2.7 of high-quality, patient-centered, comprehensive, and coordinated oral health services by
2.8 qualified providers. The demonstration projects shall seek to increase the number of new
2.9 dental providers serving medical assistance and MinnesotaCare enrollees and increase the
2.10 capacity of existing providers. The demonstration projects must test payment methods that
2.11 establish value-based incentives to:

2.12 (1) increase the extent to which current dental providers serve medical assistance and
2.13 MinnesotaCare enrollees across their lifespan;

2.14 (2) develop service models that create equity and reduce disparities in access to dental
2.15 services for high-risk and medically and socially complex enrollees;

2.16 (3) advance alternative delivery models of care within community settings using
2.17 evidence-based approaches and innovative workforce teams; and

2.18 (4) improve the quality of dental care by meeting dental home goals."
