
Dear Chair Moller,

Thank you for including HF4387, which will create a Task Force on Domestic Violence and Firearms, in your omnibus bill. This effort is important to ensure a safer Minnesota for so many women.

Our latest research with the Center on Women, Gender, & Public Policy at the University of Minnesota's Humphrey School shows that women across Minnesota face harassment, violence, and abuse at alarming and unacceptable levels. Women and girls in Minnesota are harmed by gender-based violence across their lifetimes – in their homes, on the streets, and in schools and workplaces.

2023 College Student Health Survey

Data show the need for this Task Force to understand what is happening in Minnesota and the unique circumstances facing different communities across the state.

- One in two Minnesota women report sexual violence from an intimate partner at some point in her life.
- One in four report physical violence from a partner in her lifetime.
- 2 in 5 Minnesota female college students are survivors of sexual assault.
 - Native American (43%)
 - o White (39%)
 - o Latina (38%)
 - African American (26%)
 - o Asian (21%)
- 36% of Latinas report sexual violence other than rape in their lifetimes
- 21% of 11th grade Latina girls report sexual abuse
- In 2022, at least 20 women were killed by violence from a current or former intimate partner, leaving 31 minor children without their mothers.
- Reports of rape in Minnesota increased 11% from 2020 to 2021. In 2021, Minnesota saw 2,472 cases of rape reported to law enforcement agencies, a rate of 43.3 per 100,000 population. This was an increase of 11% over 2020 (2,222 incidents). Less than one-fourth of the reported cases were cleared by arrest or exceptional means.
- Reports of rape in Minnesota increased 11% in 2021 over 2020. Less than onefourth of the reported cases were cleared by arrest or exceptional means.

Being safe is the underpinning of our ability to thrive. The data tells us there is much more we need to do in Minnesota to create safety.

The Women's Foundation envisions a Minnesota free from all forms of violence so women and girls can be safe and well at home, school, and in their communities. Passing HF 4387 is an important step toward that vision.
