1.2 Page 2, line 25, delete "and"

1.3 Page 2, line 26, delete the period and insert a semicolon

1.4 Page 2, after line 26, insert:

1.5 "(6) costs associated with emergency management, response and recovery planning,
1.6 mitigation of public health threats posed by the public safety event, and costs associated
1.7 with development of mitigation methods within the affected community;

1.8 (7) indemnifying personnel from a sending jurisdiction, if indemnification is required
1.9 by law, judicial order, or agreement between the receiving and sending jurisdictions; and

1.10 (8) costs incurred in producing an after action review and report pursuant to subdivision
1.11 13."

1.12 Page 3, after line 5, insert:

1.13 "(c) If the receiving jurisdiction refused either the commissioner's request to observe
1.14 the public safety event response or the commissioner's offer of advice and counsel, the
1.15 commissioner may deny the applicant's request for reimbursement. A receiving jurisdiction
1.16 is not obligated to follow or implement the commissioner's advice or counsel. The
1.17 commissioner may not deny a receiving jurisdiction's application for reimbursement because
1.18 the receiving jurisdiction did not follow or implement the commissioner's advice or counsel."

1.19 Page 3, line 6, delete "(c)" and insert "(d)"

1.20 Page 5, after line 22, insert:

1.21 "Subd. 13. **After action review required.** (a) The governing body of a receiving
1.22 jurisdiction that receives funds under this section must complete an after action review that
1.23 meets the requirements established in this subdivision. The review must be led by a person

2.1 who is not employed by a public safety agency that incurred reimbursable expenses or
2.2 participated in the response to the event.

2.3 (b) The review required under paragraph (a) must be a structured review, including
2.4 debriefing persons who responded to the public safety event, that analyzes the response to
2.5 the public safety event. The review must address, but is not limited to, the following topics:

2.6 (1) the applicant's expectations;

2.7 (2) a summary of events and the duties performed by those who responded to the public
2.8 safety event, including the strategies deployed;

2.9 (3) the number of citizens and public safety personnel injured or killed in the event and,
2.10 to the extent known, the cause of the injuries or deaths;

2.11 (4) a summary of the damage to property that resulted from the event;

2.12 (5) an evaluation of the performance of those who responded to the event and the
2.13 strategies deployed, including a description of successful facets of the response; and

2.14 (6) recommendations for improving or strengthening the strategies, policies, rules, and
2.15 statutes that were involved in the response to the public safety event.

2.16 (c) An after action review report must be submitted to the chair of the Peace Officer
2.17 Standards and Training Board's Ensuring Police Excellence and Improving Community
2.18 Relations Advisory Council no later than 60 days after an applicant receives reimbursement
2.19 under this section. The applicant may withhold or redact any information that would
2.20 compromise the safety of public safety officers or compromise future responses to public
2.21 safety events.

2.22 (d) Upon submission of an after action report that satisfies the requirements of this
2.23 subdivision, the commissioner shall reimburse an applicant for the cost of the after action
2.24 review and report."

2.25 Page 5, after line 27, insert:

2.26 "Sec. 3. **PEACE OFFICER STANDARDS AND TRAINING BOARD;**
2.27 **APPROPRIATION.**

2.28 \$..... in fiscal year 2022 is appropriated from the general fund to the Peace Officer
2.29 Standards and Training Board to develop the model policy required under Minnesota Statutes,
2.30 section 626.8476."
