Minnesota's Coalition for Family Home Visiting (MCFHV) writes in support of HF 2900, to fund key programs in the Minnesota Department of Human Services that support Minnesota's families. We believe that investing in family and early care and learning workforce will help provide stability for families. By improving recruitment, education and retention to equitably support those providing critical support to Minnesota's families will positively position children and their parents for a lifetime of success.

Please consider the importance of following programs and provisions and support HF 2900:

Direct Reimbursement for Doula Services [148.995] Article 8. Sec. 13. Subd. 28b. Line 150.14 Doulas are proven to lower racial disparities in healthcare by improving health outcomes, increasing breastfeeding rates, reducing childbirth complications, and reestablishing the relationship between historically marginalized communities and the medical establishment. As advocates and birthing educators, doulas should have the ability to bill directly for their services. By allowing doulas to be directly reimbursed for their services, they will be able to overcome the many barriers that come with the supervisor requirement.

Child Care Article 1. Beginning on Line 2.22

Investing in early care and learning is integral to increase access to high-quality early childhood programs for Minnesota's youngest children and stabilize families in these early years. By bridging the funding gaps for low-income families to receive quality care and learning will improve school readiness in populations with the highest needs.
