Proposed Resolution Urging the Federal Government to Fund Research on Microplastics in the Environment

1	WHEREAS,	microplastics are pieces of plastic that are less than five millimeters in size
2		which can result from the disposal and breakdown of products and
3		industrial waste containing plastics; and
4		
5	WHEREAS,	the majority of plastics in the United States are not recycled; and
6		
7	WHEREAS,	recent studies have shown that microplastics are pervasive in the
8		environment; and
9		
10	WHEREAS,	microplastics are easily ingested by plankton and filter feeding animals
11		and are found in many species of wildlife including fish and shellfish;

14	WHEREAS,	microplastics have been found in bottled water and other consumer
15		products intended for human consumption; and
16		
17	WHEREAS,	microplastics have been found in human stools; and
18		
19	WHEREAS,	scientists still know little about the effects of microplastics on the human
20		body or on wildlife; and
21		
22	WHEREAS,	water resources, including drinking water, and soils and sediments are
23		rarely tested or monitored for microplastics; and



24	WHEREAS,	questions still remain as to the sources of microplastics in the
25		environment, including the contributions from wastewater treatment
26		facilities; and
27		
28	WHEREAS,	research is needed to understand the impacts of microplastics on the
29		environment and human health and to develop testing and monitoring
30		protocols; now therefore be it
31		
32	RESOLVED,	that the Great Lakes-St. Lawrence Legislative Caucus urges the United
33		States Environmental Protection Agency to increase research efforts on
34		microplastics; and be it further
35		
36	RESOLVED,	that a copy of this resolution be sent to President Donald Trump,
37		Attorney General William Barr, and all members of Congress.
