Nature of complaint

The state House campaign committee for Rep. Ilhan Omar continues as active, In its 2017 year-end filing, the committee lists a number of travel-related campaign and noncampaign disbursements. As discussed in this Complaint, several of these disbursements appear to fall outside of allowable campaign committee expenditures under state law.

The 2017 Committee report includes a campaign expenditure in the amount of \$337.40 on August 19 to Delta Air Lines for "Airfare / Public Transportation to Boston to speak at rally". An Internet search reveals that Rep. Omar spoke in Boston on that date at a rally for Boston City Council District 7 candidate Deego Jibril (see Atlachment A).

Minnesota Statutes 10A,01, Subd, 9 defines as a campaign expenditure one "...made or incurred for the purpose of influencing the nomination or election of a candidate...". Subd, 10 defines a candidate as an individual who "...has taken the action necessary under the law of this state to qualify for nomination or election..." A search of the MN Campaign Finance Board website reveals no Minnesota candidate by the name Deego Jibril, The Committee's expenditure of Minnesota campaign funds to assist the candidacy of a Massachusetts city council candidate is not permitted under Minnesota taw.

There are a number of travel-related noncampaign disbursements listed in the Committee's 2017 year-end report, Minnesota Statutes 10A,01 Subd, 26 lists 23 allowed noncampaign expenditure items. Minnesota Rules 4502,0900 lists an additional six allowed items.

The Board's current Candidate Handbook includes the following discussion of travel-related noncampaign expenditures

The cost of attending, an out-of-state conference could also fall under this noncampaign expenditures.

The cost of attending, an out-of-state conference could also fall under this noncampaign disbursement category if the candidate would not attend the event if he or she were not an officeholder and the reason the candidate attends the event is to assist the candidate in performing his or her legislative duties. Trips that are for general fact-finding and relationship building, such as meeting with the state's congressional delegation in Washington, D.C., are not reasonable costs of serving in office that may be paid for with campaign committee funds.

The Committee's year-end 2017 report includes a total of \$581.43 to the Hilton Garden Inn, Washington DC, for "Girl Empowerment conference". This item appears to reference the July 2017 Girl Up Leadership Summit. As shown in this You Tube video (https://www.youtube.com/watch/v=wol/4WGUF2wc) Rep. Omar served as a Summit speaker, and the only elected official among the named speakers. The event appears to bear no relation to Rep. Omar's performance of her duties as a legislator.

The 2017 report includes an item in the amount of \$232.20 for Delta Air Lines for "speaking at National Imigrant (sic) Justice Center-Chicago." The item appears to refer to a June 2017 event where Rep. Omar provided a keynote speech and received an award from this organization (see Atlachment B). This appearance does not fit the definition of assisting the candidate with her legislative duties.

The 2017 report includes an item for \$207 for Spirit Airlines for "return from Somali New Arrival conference." The item does not include any information on location or how the event helped assist the candidate in performing her legislative duties.

Finally, in the 2017 report there are expenses totaling \$1,700.80 for Delta Air Lines, Estair OU Talinn, and KLM Royal Dutch Airlines for attending the September 2017 European Young Leaders Seminar in Tallinn, Estonia Minnesota borders neither Estonia nor any other European country. Nor does the state legislature address any foreign policy or issues involving international relations. This item appears to fall squarely under "general fact-finding and relationship building."

Minnesota Statutes 211B.12 Subd. 7 (last sentence) states, "Money collected for political purposes and assets of a political committee or political fund may not be converted to personal use." It appears that Rep. Omar personally benefited from the payment of certain travel costs by her principal campaign committee, in violation of state law.

Minnesota Statutes section 10A.022, subdivision 3, describes the procedures required for investigating complaints. A full description of the complaint process is available on the Board's website.

Briefly, the Board will notify you when it has received your complaint. The Board must send a copy of the complaint to the respondent. Complaints and investigations are confidential. Board members and staff cannot talk about an investigation except as required to carry out the investigation or to take action in the matter. After the Board issues a decision, the record of the investigation is public.

The law requires a complaint to go through two stages before the Board can begin an investigation: a prima facie determination and a probable cause decision. If the complaint does not pass one of the stages, it must be dismissed.

The Board has 10 business days after receiving your complaint to determine whether the complaint is sufficient to allege a prima facie violation of the campaign finance laws. If the Board determines that the complaint does allege a prima facie violation, the Board has 45 days to decide whether probable cause exists to believe a violation that warrants a formal investigation has occurred. Both you and the respondent have the right to be heard on the issue of probable cause before the Board makes this decision. The Board will notify you if the complaint moves to the probable cause stage.

If the Board determines that probable cause does not exist, the Board will dismiss the complaint. If the Board determines that probable cause exists, the Board will start an investigation. The Board will send you monthly updates regarding the status of the investigation. At the end of the investigation, the Board will offer you and the respondent the opportunity to be heard before the Board makes a final decision.

In most cases, the Board will issue findings, conclusions, and an order as its decision. For a spending or contribution limits violation, the Board can enter into a conciliation agreement with the respondent instead of issuing findings, conclusions, and an order. The Board's final decision will be sent to you and posted on the Board's website.
