Overview

This bill permits law enforcement, probation, prosecutors, and the courts to share data between agencies for purposes of making pretrial, sentencing, or supervision decisions without changing the classification of the data.

- 1 Access by probationary agencies.** Permits law enforcement to share *not public data* with probation for use in preparing pretrial release/bail, sentencing, or supervision recommendations. *Not public data* keeps its classification under this section.
- 2 Domestic violence history summary.** Provides that domestic violence history data compiled by the court, probation, or corrections on an individual is *confidential data* but may be shared with law enforcement, prosecutors, court services, probation, or corrections when performing pretrial release supervision or studies. *Confidential data* is inaccessible to the individual subject to the data.

Clarifies that information in the summary may be released to defense counsel when the summary is submitted to the court.
- 3 Law enforcement data.** Cross-reference in § 13.84 - "Court services data." Provides that law enforcement data shared pursuant to section 1 retains its *not public data* classification and may be released under the same circumstances as all other private or confidential law enforcement data.
