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## Overview

The 2015 Legislature codified the full-service community school model. The law directs the commissioner of education to fund eligible school sites through grants. An eligible school site must be a school that is on a development plan for continuous improvement or a school in a district that has an approved achievement and integration plan.

A qualifying school site may receive an annual grant of up to \$150,000 for activities of the full-service community school including hiring a site coordinator.

The statute describes the manner by which the school leadership team is to develop school-specific programming goals, assess program needs, and oversee the process of implementing expanded programming at the site. The full-service community school is required to do a baseline analysis before beginning programming as a full-service community school and conduct a three-year review of its activities.

HF 146 appropriates \$10 million per year for full-service community schools.
