

Subject Window tinting for prescription or medical needs

Overview

This bill broadens an existing exception to the prohibition on motor vehicle window tinting that is available based on a prescription or medical statement. Currently tinting that reduces light transmittance beyond a specified maximum is allowed if the driver or passenger has a prescription or physician's statement indicating medical need, and which states the minimum percentage of light reduction needed. Under the bill, the prescription or statement does not have to be issued for the driver or a passenger, but it must identify the motor vehicle that it applies to and must be kept in the identified vehicle.

It also makes grammatical and organizational changes, including moving exceptions to the general prohibition on tinting into a separate subdivision.
